Dear Ms Bonnell,

Recently I ordered a book, **"The Bunnell/Bonnell Family in America—Volume 1,"** by **William R Austin**, from heritage Books, Inc., Bowie MD. When I opened the second page of the book, and saw the picture of the Nathaniel Bunnell House in Elizabeth, New Jersey, I knew I had the right book! Upon further reading, I recognized various names that also appeared in my aunt **Fern Bonnell's** book, **"The Bonnells" – A family History 1811-1950**", including a reprint of the Genealogy, 1638-1904, written by **Albert Bonnell, 1904**. Albert was **Fern's** father and my g-father.

Through the **Nathaniel Bonnell** (b 1731, Elizabethtown, Essex, NJ) line, my mother became a member of the D.A.R. in Iowa in the 40's, and my daughter and I became members in 1996, in Stillwell, KS. Although Mr. Austin, the author of the Bunnell/Bonnell Book states, on page 145, that **"Nathaniel Bonnell** was born in 1731 in Elizabethtown, Essex (now Union) Co, NJ" my D.A.R. eligibility reference states, "Born 29 December 1731 Chatham (Morris Co.) NJ and died 03, July 1809 Chatham, Morris Co., NJ. His wife was **Mary Simpson** married 24 Nov 1775. He was a Private in the Militia in Chatham, New Jersey, Morris Co."

Is this **Nathaniel Bonnell** (p. 147 Bunnell/Bonnell Bk) and my D.A.R. Revolutionary ancestor, **Nathaniel Bonnell**, one and the same? Which **Nathaniel Bonnell** is being referred to here? My grandfather, **Albert Bonnell** in his 1638-1904 Genealogy started, **"Capt. Nathaniel**, (2nd son of **Nathaniel Bonnell**, 1st), was born 1731: -- died July 1809; he lived where his grandson **Daniel L. Bonnel**, now lives. By his first wife, **Elizabeth Allen**, he had 13 children. **Nancy**, the 10th child, born July 1778, married her cousin, **Sylvanus Bonnel**, son of **John**." [A few pages later, my grandfather writes, **"Sylvanus**, born 28 January, 1773, married his cousin, **Nancy Bonnel**, daughter of **Capt. Nathaniel**."] It is from this line that **Albert** is descended. His father was **James Harvey Bonnel**, b. June 10, 1811, New Jersey, who came to Iowa in 1843.

From my aunt (who died in 1983), I have inherited information and pictures of the early Iowa **Bonnell's**, but have not attempted to do an Update! In 1998, for D.A.R., I prepared an Update on the **Lee-Bargar Family** – tying in with the **Albert Bonnell** line. Do you have an annual **Bonnell Reunion?**

Would enjoy hearing from you, and receiving your Newsletter.

Legacy of Slave artisans lives on- The Virginia Pilot Hampton Roads – Monday June 12, 2000
A story of Albemarle exhibit details 1730-1865 work on Southern estates, statehouses by Frank Roberts. It seems the Elizabeth City, NC. Tourists are drawn to the North Carolina homes, plantations and private estates that, unknown to most, were created by the hard labor of slaves working from daylight to dark. Slave labor was even forced to remodel the St Paul's Episcopal Church, according to this article.

Although payment was made for the labor, it was collected by one owner Josiah Collins who used some of the money to outfit slave ships to bring more slaves from Africa to America. A story of one

of the workers, an African-American named **Joe Welcome**, and stories of other slaves can be found in the Museum of the Albemarle Exhibit US 17, south of Elizabeth City, NC; "[African American Builders & Architects of the Albemarle – 1730-1865](#)" The exhibit can be seen until Dec 31, 2000. (oops! – maybe you can find out where it went from here??)

This information was sent to the newsletter from **John C Bonnell** because it mentions a **Rufus Bunnell** who worked on some of these jobs and was amazed at the slaves working from sunup to sundown for no pay, no matter the amount of intelligence of the slave. **Rufus Bunnell** was a well-respected draftsman of the area wrote of the skills as architects, sawyers, carpenters, joiners, plasterers, bricklayers and painters. He was disturbed at the amount of work and lack of humane treatment these slaves received on these jobs.

(The 'full' article is an interesting yet lengthy one. Do to copyright laws, it can't be printed here in its entirety. I will copy it, for anyone interested, for the cost of copy and postage – Thank you John - Carole)

Letter from Claude Bunnell – email cbunnel@home.com 12-17-2000 – He needs your help!

Hi Carole,

I suppose you may be in your winter home now, but I assume you will receive your email there. I will be sending my subscription fee for 2001 by separate mail in a few days. *(I am Leaving for AZ 15th January - Carole)*

The big news is, I think I have made the connection of Isaac Bonnell who died in Guernsey Co, Ohio in 1834 to ancestor, William Bunnell. Isaac of Guernsey Co (00533) is the same as Isaac Bonnell (300164) son of Abraham Bonnell (290024) of Hunterdon Co, NJ.

The assumption for the connection is that Isaac married a **Catherine (Severns)**. There is a statement in the West Jersey Society minutes dated 16 October 1788 that the **Widow Severns** wanted to purchase a property for her son-in-law, **Isaac Bonnell**. The Widow had been living in Hell Town, which today is Spring Mills in Holland Township, Hunterdon Co., NJ.

The name of **Isaac Bonnell** appears in tax lists in Kingwood Twp and Alexandria Twp in Hunterdon Co from 1778 to 1790. Not further tax indication after 1790. His children appear to have been born in NJ from 1780 to 1794 and in VA from 1800 to 1804.

There appears to be no deed records of **Isaac** buying or selling property in NJ or VA. He bought land in Crawford Co, PA in 1808 and sold it in 1812. In 1814, he bought land in Guernsey Co, OH and lived there until his death in 1834.

Isaac founded the town of Winchester in Guernsey Co, OH but it was later named Winterset for postal reference. The two names of Frederick and Winchester leads me to believe he may have lived in Frederick Co, VA whose county seat is Winchester.

I have contacted the county clerk of Frederick Co, VA and learned there are no deed records for an **Isaac Bonnell** in the years of 1790 to 1810. Some of **Isaac's** children were married in Loudoun Co VA and lived there a few years before moving to Guernsey Co, OH.

I have to thank **Clement Bonnell** for much research he did in trying to confirm the connection as well as consultation with **Bill Austin**. I think we all agree the evidence of the connection of **Isaac** of Guernsey Co, OH to the son of **Abraham** is at this time not conclusive. Additional information on his location in VA is needed and records of his marriage and children births. **Hopefully, some of your subscribers and correspondents may have some additional clues and I would appreciate hearing from them to see if we can complete the connection.**

From Tiffin Daily Tribune – Sept 9, 1896 –

Alfred S BONNELL, farmer, P.O. Watson, a son of **William** and **Anna M (Buyter) BONNELL**, was born in Pleasant Township, this county, January 13, 1847. He was reared a farmer, an occupation he still follows. He was united in marriage, May 6, 1869, with Miss **Emma Norris**, of Scipio Township, this county, where she was born Dec 11, 1852, daughter of **Lott** and **Lurana (Todd) Norris**, who, in a very early day, emigrated from Maryland to this county, where they reared, a large family, of whom Mrs. Bonnell is the youngest.

To Mr. & Mrs. Bonnell were born four children: **Estella E** (deceased), **Nellie M**, **Charles A.** and **Bertha B (latter deceased)**. Mrs. Bonnell is a member of the Methodist Church. Mr. Bonnell is a staunch Republican in politics.

His parents, (no names given) natives of Lycoming County and Philadelphia, Penn., respectively, were married in Lycoming county, Penn., thence came to Ohio and settled in Pleasant Township, this county, in May 1838, and here reared their family of eight children: **Catherine A**, **John G**, **Mary E**, **Jacob T.**, **Margaret J**, **Richard W**, **James P**, and **Alfred S Bonnell**, all living but **Mary E** and **Richard W**.

The father died April 15, 1885, the mother still resides on the homestead farm with her daughter and son in law, **Margaret J** and **Daniel Collow**, who were married December 27, 1863, and are the parents of two daughters: **Maggie E** and **Minnie A.** (from **Ronald J Meyers, Vanwert, OH**)

Norris Reunion – Bloomville (same paper as above)

Last Thursday, Sept 3, was the Norris reunion day. It was held at the home of **Andrew Miller**, on the Portland road (St Rt 101, in 2000), near Egbert's (now Pleasant Ridge UM) church. It was a grand success in every way, although the weather was quite unfavorable in the morning.

A large crowd gathered and spent the forenoon in social greeting. Some had not met in forty-five years and some affecting meetings resulted. A bountiful supply of the things that go to sustain the inner man were served. The friends were then called to order by president **John Norris** of Van Wert, OH. After remarks by **William Hyter**, of Clinton Township, and **George Kishler**, of Eden Township, several fine selections were sung by the young people.

An election was held and the old officers were continued for another year. The reunion will be held three miles north and one mile west of Republic, at the old **Coffman** home, now owned by **William Norris**, of Tiffin, and occupied by his son, **M.E. Norris**, the very efficient secretary of the family.

Among those present of the older stock of the **Norris** families were **John Norris**, of Van Wert, son of **Nathaniel Norris**, one of the early pioneers of this county; **William**, **Ephraim** and **John T.** (not the detective), **Mrs. Bonnell** and **Mrs. Vandiveer** {sic} **Norris**, also a pioneer; **Mrs. Sarah Norris-Scott**, of Tiffin, daughter of **Eli Norris** the veteran tavern keeper of the early thirties: **Mrs. Susan Norris-Myers**, of Green

Spring {sic} and **E.D. Norris**, of Bloomville, children of **John Norris**, brother of **Eli**, who died in Tiffin, Feb 12, 1839.

These, with their descendants {sic}, and several invited friends, made a company of about one hundred and fifty and one thing that went a good ways toward making your correspondent proud of the company was that at least 90 per cent of the company was from McKenley.

(Note: **Nathaniel** and **Lott Norris** were sons of **Thomas P Norris** who married sisters, **Sarah** and **Luranor Todd**, daughters of **Thomas Todd**.) (from **Ronald J Meyers, Vanwert, OH**)

From the back of the book: "Sometimes Genealogy Can Be Murder.....Family lore claimed his ancestor was murdered in Mississippi. Newspapers and court records said the man and four victims were killed and incinerated in his remote country store. But the case was never solved. Now after 30 years of investigating, the great great grandson of the slain carpetbagger – whose charred remains were "only a few bones" – revels what really happened at Rolling Fork Landing on that night of March 4, 1873.And his conclusion is not what you would expect!"

There are 83 pages of End Notes for 41 chapters, every fact is documented. There are also 58 maps and illustrations. The author tells you exactly which details are fact and which are surmised. I hear it is a fascinating story with colorful characters. Outlander, Dragonfly in Amber, Voyager and Drums of Autumn, by Diana Gabaldon . 4 very large books, but worth every page. I have read 2 of the four and my Mom has read all 4. Here is an outline of all 4 books from the back of the 4th book: " It began in Scotland, (she and her husband were there to research his family history!) At the ancient stone circle, there, a doorway, open to a select few, leads into the past...or the grave. Clare Randall survived the extraordinary passage, not once but twice. Her first trip swept her into the arms of Jamie Fraser, an eighteenth-century Scot whose love for her became legend – a tale of tragic passion that ended with her return to the present to bear his child. Her second journey, 2 decades later, brought them together again in the frontier America. But Clare had left someone behind in the twentieth century...their daughter, Brianna.

Now, Brianna has made a disturbing discovery that sends her to the stone circle and a terrifying leap into the unknown. In search of her mother and the father she has never met, she is risking her own future to try to change history...and to save their lives. But as Brianna plunges into an uncharted wilderness, a heartbreaking encounter may strand her forever in the past...or root her in the place she should be, where her heart and soul belong."

This is historical fiction at it's best. A rich mix of history, fantasy, romance and adventure. I have enjoyed this storytelling in the fullest.
