Dear Carole,

My name is Laura Bunnell and I have been researching my husband's family who came out of NB Canada. I recently posted a message to the GenForum and received a reply from your cousin Betsy David who advised me to get in touch with you. I am also here in Washington State (Moses Lake) and have exhausted my resources on the Bunnell family line.

Betsy gave me information about two family lines from NB I believe that we may be looking at the other line descending from **Benjamin Bonnell** born about 1744. She said that Sarah Day and Benjamin Jr. had a son Joseph and that Joseph had a son Joseph, born 1841.

I am looking for Joseph born in St. John, NB. The date of Betsy's Joseph and my Joseph are possible making Joseph 33 when Fredrick James was born 1874 (St. John NB) I also know that his wife (mother of Fred) is Isabella Miles. I found Frederick James on the NB Late register of births but couldn't find his parents births records (maybe where the name changed?) I will be going back to that search forum and plug in Bonnell, maybe they will be there.

If there is any way to verify and expand upon this info I received from Betsy I would greatly appreciate it. It blew a big hole into the family line for me. My husband is the first member of The church of Jesus Christ of Latterday Saints, in his immediate family and so we don't know very much about his family or their background (he was surprised when he found out that they came down through Canada!).

(3/11/01 I received an email from Dot inquiring about a subscription cost for the newsletter. I answered her with the information and asked what her Bunnell connection was. Dot heard about our newsletter by way of Kay Cutshall and the Bunnell/Bonnell RootsWeb list)

Teri, thanks so much for your response. I'm not really sure how I should give you the information I have on my Bunnell's. I am going to give you some info here and if you prefer, I can send group sheets or whatever by mail. Here is a brief summary of what I have:

My grandfather, **Isaac Newton Bunnell**, was born June 26, 1874 in Dyer Co., TN and died there Oct 11, 1951. He married Lee Rena Parker Jan 20, 1901. Their children were Lee Newtie born May 11, 1903; Mary Gladys born July 24, 1904; Herbert Wilson born Oct 8, 1907; Luke Lee born Nov 18, 1910; Radford born Sept 16, 1921.

My Ggrandfather, **Wilson Asberry Bunnell**, was born March 12, 1834 in Gibson Co., TN and died July 23, 1905 in Dyer Co., TN. He married Justianna (Jettie) Tarkington on July 31, 1963. Their children were: William H., Mary Lula, John Morgan, Isaac Newton, Lucy and Wilson Baker.

My GGGrandfather, **Isaac Newton Bunnell** was born in 1792 in NC (I believe Currituck Co.) and died in Dyer Co., TN on April 11, 1877. He married Lavinia (Lovey) O'Neal in NC and their children (according to census info which only gives initials) were: PL, SE, WA (that's my Wilson Asberry), AE (she was called Annie), WH and IN, Jr.

I believe his father might have been **Edward Bunnell** who married ?? Duke, granddaughter of John Cave. Their children were: William, Isaac, John, Moses, Katey and Betsey.

Hi Dottie, I have a copy of your email dated 3/11/01 to Teri Bonnell. I have all the line you listed but you added some dates I lacked. Also the connection with Edward was new. I would appreciate it if you would send me any documentation you have on Edward and his

wife and children. With the information I have I could not find an Edward that might extend the line. Possibly with the documentation you have, I might make a further connection. Hope to hear from you. Claude Bunnell.

From the "History of Williamsburg" by William Willis Boddie Published by "The Reprint Company, Publishers, Spartanburg, SC, 1992

Page 53 under Churches & Churchmen:

The pew holders in Prince Frederick's Church in 1734 were as follows: Zjohn Brown, John Lane, Reverend Thomas Morritt, John Thompson, Daniel Shaw, Francis Avant, John Wallace, Esq., Captain Anthony White, Anthony Atkinson, John White, Paul Laroche, William Swinton, **John Borrell**, Josias Dupre and Caleb Avant. All of these men lived along Black River, some of them as far westward into the present Williamsburg County as Indiantown and Cedar Swamp. This Prince Frederick's Church was wealthy. The Reverend Mr. Morritt, who conducted services one Sunday in each month of 1735 in Georgetown and three Sundays at Prince Frederick's, admitted that his income was more than \$7,500.00 a year.

(Note: the index lists him as Bonnell)

Page 56:

On the 3rd of November, 1770, **Mary Bonnell** died under suspicious circumstances. The matter of her sudden passing created great interest in all this community. After she had been buried thirty-six days, her body was raised from its grave and examined by Samuel Nesmith, Esq., Coroner, "For our said Lord the King," and his Coroner's jury composed of James Lane, Foreman, Bartley Clark, Elias McPherson, Richard Green, Francis Green, William Green, William Green, Sr., Francis Futhy, John Glenn, Sr., Daniel Williams, James McPherson and John McCrea. The first sessions of this Jury were held in the Prince Frederick's Church but later meetings were had at Black Mingo.

Here is my Bonnell connection, which hasn't moved for some time now:

My maternal grandmother was **Mary Etta Bonnel** born 27 July 1860 in Camden Platte, Mo. She died 23 June 1952 in Kingman, Kingman, KS. She married James Henry Freeland on 2 Sept 1853.

Mary Etta's father was **Charles Fredrick Bonnel** born 24 Oct 1833 in Stark Co., OH and died 30 March 1919 in Benton Twp., Atchison, KS. He married Mary Catherine (Mollie) Shouse on 4 Oct 1859 in Atchison Co., KS. Mollie was born on 18 Sept 1841 on Louisville, Jefferson Co., KY. She died on 2 April 1903 in Atchison Co., KS.

Their children were: Mary Etta, Charles Fredrick, Benjamin Edward, Margaret C., Elnora, William Fredrick, Ida Lee, Catherine Estella, John Rice, Thomas B., Henry Edward, Laura Emma, Myrtle E., Sarah Elizabeth, Eve Lena, and Josie May. My grandmother Mary Etta always said she was the oldest and did most of the raisin' for 16 kids.

Mary Etta's grandfather was **William S. Bonnel**. He was born on 5 June 1810 in either VA or KY. He died on 19 Feb 1874 in Weston, Platte Co., MO. He married Catherine Schell (Shell) who was born on 10 June 1819 in Lincoln Co., NC, and died on 3 Feb 1901 on Platte Co., MO.

Their kids that I know of were: Charles Fredrick, Mary Margaret, Rebecca and Leah.

Mary Etta's great grandfather was **Jonathan Bonnel**. He was born in either 1774 or 1784 in VA. In 1809 he married Polly (Mary??) Hahn who was born in VA in 1789.

That's all I have on my direct line. I have some info on the siblings. I'd surely like to push back beyond Jonathan. I've been at a dead end with him for some time.

Kay is looking for connections to her grandfather, Judson O. Bunnell. I want to Thank Kay for getting the word out about the Bunnell/Bonnell Newsletter by way of RootsWeb. We acquired a few new subscribers.

Dear Bunnell/Bonnell helpers,

I am enclosing 4 pages of information, some proved and some not. This is information I have gathered as I have been trying to establish the correct parents/grandparents of **Judson O. Bunnell**, my grandfather. He is mentioned as son "Jeddy" of Clarks Corners, in Susan A. Iron's obit and in the obit of John (son of Aaron and Susan), Judson of Conneaut O, is mentioned as a brother. He could possibly be the Sady listed as a son in the 1870 census with Aaron and Susan. Of all the children for Aaron & Susan Irons, Judson is the only one I cannot find proof positive for. Also, as you will see in the material I am enclosing, the information on Judson's death certificate, signed by son **J.F. Bunnell**, names **James Bunnell** and Lina Munson as his parents but it also names Ella as his wife. (His wife Emma preceded him in death.)

I have been unable to find any Lina Munson & **James Bunnell** but, I am hesitant to dismiss Lina & James since Judson & Emma had a son that was named James Faye (he never used the names James)...they also had a daughter named Lina Grace.

I believe I have the correct information for the Bunnell line of Susan A. Bishop who married **Aaron W. Bunnell** but I am not sure who Aaron's parents are? Could this Aaron W. be the J. Aaron listed as one of Samuel (b.1780) sons? (See the information I have enclosed).

So much for information, so many unanswered questions!

Feel free to use any of the information I have sent. Hope some of it will be of help to someone and also that it will help to establish my Bunnell lines thru my mother's mother **Irene Morse Bunnell**.

Also am enclosing a check to subscribe to the newsletter.

In 1842 Samuel left home and went to Buffalo, New York, and worked on the caman a short time when all hands struck. In July he went to Kinsman, and remained there about two months, went to Essex County, New Jersey, where he worked at shoemaking for about eighteen months, and from there he went to Lucerne County, Pennsylvania, and lumbered for a year, and then to Plainfield, New Jersey, and peddled tobacco for four months. He then went to work on a farm and worked four months, and from that he went to work at the carpenter trade, which he followed until 1847, when he returned home and bought the old homestead where he lived for eleven years. William sent Joan the following letter and information:

Dear Mrs. Flavel:

Thank you for sending me the material on your Bonnell ancestry. I have made copies for my own files and am forwarding your package to the Bunnell/Bonnell Newsletter.

Enclosed you will find a printout of all the information I have gathered on your line back to David Bonnell. Where I have added data from your package it is noted in the references with code C575-, since you are the 575th person I have corresponded with on this family. The printout includes all the information I have on the male descendants of your grandfather, **Charles Leveret Bonnell**, but I did not include the descendants of David, Henry or Emmanuel that are not in your direct line. Please let me know of any corrections or additions you think appropriate.

The ancestry of **David Bonnell** is a real problem. The only David I have found in New Jersey who is a possibility is David, oldest child of Isaac and Puah Abigail (Woodruff) Bonnell. Isaac is number 1-3-1-4-5 CB300194 on page 152 of my book. His son David could not have been born much before 1765 based on the ages of his parents. Also, David's grandfather, in his will dated February 1786, left him 40 shillings to be paid when he reached his majority. In other words, he was not yet 21 years old.

Your ancestor David appears in the Federal census four times, in 1800, 1810, 1820 and 1830. In 1830 he was between 60 and 70 years old, thus born between 1760 and 1770. The 1800 and 1820 censuses, expressed differently, support that period but give a somewhat broader range. The 1810 census, however, says specifically that he was over 45; in other words, born before 1765.

Assuming that the 1810 census is correct (which it may not be), and that it was conducted as of 1 June 1810, if David was born in March, April or May 1765, he would have still been a minor in February when his grandfather wrote his will and yet have passed the 45-year mark when the 1810 census was taken. This is cutting it pretty close. Age data in the census records is quite unreliable and it is possible his age was overstated in 1810.

There is one other indication that throws considerable doubt on this identification. The New Jersey Journal printed a notice that a **David Bonnel** drowned at the Old Point on 20 July 1816 at age 47. I don't know of another David Bonnell in the Elizabeth, NJ, area who was born about 1769. Only one David appears in the 1793 militia census in Essex co, NJ. This David who drowned in 1816 would seem to be the better bet as the son of Isaac, since he was in the right place, while your

David was not. It should be noted that, as far as I know, no other record of a David Bonnell has been found in the Elizabeth area after 1793.

Some years ago I published a couple of articles in the Bunnell/Bonnell Newsletter calling attention to the men in the third, fourth and fifth generations who could have had children that we have not identified. On the Bonnell side there were:

You can review all of these in my book to see what I have learned about them. Any or all of them could have died childless, but I think that is unlikely. I believe that all of the New Jersey Bonnells, born before 1800, whose parentage we haven't discovered, would fit into one of the above families if we can discover the necessary evidence.

Just recently, evidence has turned up to identify an **Isaac Bonnell** with 11 children to be the same person as 1-3-2-2-3 D71 CB300164. In my book I stated about him, "I have not been able to discover any records to show whether or not he married or had children." Now we know that he had not only a wife and children, but a great many descendants, many of whom have been searching for his ancestry for years.

The moral is Keep Hoping and Keep Searching! You never know when someone will unearth the obscure piece of evidence that solves your problem.

DAVID BONNELL was born in the 1760-s apparently in New Jersey. He married MARY ANN MASTERS in New Jersey. At the time of the 1800 census they were living in Londonderry twp, Bedford co, PA. He is listed as David Bundle, with 1 male and 2 females under 10, a male and a female from 10 to 16, 1 male from 16 to 26, and 1 male and 1 female from 26 to 45. In 1804 he appears as executor of the will of Henry Amerine, Sr., of Bedford co. In the triennial assessment tax list for Bedford co in 1808, David was listed with 25 acres of warranted land, 175 acres of improved land and 2 cows. Tax assessed was \$.99. On 1 February 1810 he was appointed by Pennsylvania Governor Simon Snyder to the position of Justice of the Peace in the district including Londonderry twp, Bedford co., David Bonnell appears in the 1810 census in Londonderry twp with 1 male under 10, 1 between 10 to 16, 2 between 16 to 26, and 1 male over 45; also, 2 females under 10, 1 between 10 to 16, 2 between 16 to 26, 1 between 26 to 45, and

1 female over 45. In the Bedford co Orphan's Court, there is a writ to divide property dated 5 March 1811. [I have not seen it. It should be examined, since it might include useful information.] In 1813 David witnessed the will of John Hains in Bedford co. David and Mary Ann appear in the 1820 census of Londonderry twp living alone, both over 45. The 1830 census of Londonderry twp lists them as 1 male and 1 female between 60 and 70. In 1834 he sold land in Bedford co to C. Wolford, and in 1835 he bought land from George Karchner, again in Bedford co. He died before April 1838, when his sons Henry and John, as administrators of his estate, petitioned for the sale of his real estate.

HENRY BONNELL, son of David, was born about 1795 probably in New Jersey. He moved with his parents to Bedford co, PA, before 1800. On 9 January 1821 he married PEGGY (MARGARET) HOWARD, who was born about 1800. He appears on the 1840 census of Bedford co, PA, with his wife, 8 boys and 1 girl. In 1841 he sold property in Bedford co as one of the administrators of his father's estate. In 1846 he appears on the triennial tax assessment books of Londonderry twp, Bedford co. In 1850 he was living in Richland twp, Belmont co, OH, with his wife and six children. On 212 November 1857 the Court of Common Pleas of Bedford co ordered the County Sheriff to seize property owned by Henry in payment of a debt of \$114. 51 owed to Abraham Schroyer and perhaps others. The Sheriff sold the land to William Bonnell CB011979, whose relationship to this family is not known. By 1860 Henry had moved with his brother John to Bureau co, IL, where he was living in 1865. When the 1870 census was taken in Bureau co Henry was living with his son Henry, Jr. He and his wife were buried in the Hill cemetery, 2 miles east of LaMoille, Bureau co, IL.

MADISON BURNELL, son of Hon. **Joel Burnell**, was born February 10, 1812, in Charlotte, Chautauqua county, N.Y., where his parents had previously settled. He was the second of 11 children, 6 sons and 5 daughters. His childhood and youth were spent on the farm, and he shared in the toil of changing the wilderness into cultivated fields. His father possessed a brilliant intellect and was a great reader. His mother possessed a superior judgment. It was at his home where the intellect of Madison received its inspiration to thought and independent action. His few school books were easily mastered and the miscellaneous reading about the house was easily devoured. At Fredonia academy he spent half a term and a term at Middlebury academy, Genesee, now Wyoming county. In his sixteenth year, he taught a district school in Hanover; while he was eagerly reading Blackstone's Commentaries and

other law books. Cases tried before his father had familiarized his mind with court proceedings. He early conducted a prosecution against a thief for sheep stealing with such skill and ingenuity as to obtain a verdict from the entire community, that the boy was “cut out” to be a lawyer. He soon after entered the law office of Richard P. Marvin and Emory F. Warren of Jamestown, as a law student. He made rapid advancement in legal knowledge and derived a pleasure as well as profit from the study of law. His profound knowledge of the fundamental elements of law, became, in after years, the fortress of his strength. He once served a creditor some \$8,000.00, by acting upon what he thought *the law ought to be*, while his opponent acted upon what he *supposed the law was*. He spent several years with Judge Martin and made no haste to gain an early admission to the bar. He was admitted about the year 1838 and at once entered into partnership with his preceptors. The firm of Marvin & Burnell is said to have done most of the heavy law business of the place. **Mr. Burnell** was a member of assembly in 1846 and 1847. The session of 1847 was the first after the adoption of the new constitution; and he was a chairman of the judiciary committee. In this position he did the state great service in adjusting the statutes to the new constitution.

When Mr. Marvin was elevated to the bench, **Mr. Burnell** continued the business of the office and entered the field more largely as an advocate; and it was generally conceded that he had few if any superiors in this part of the state. Amidst the excitements of the legal contest as well as in social intercourse, he was the same true and honest man, despising deception and trickishness. He had a deep insight into human nature and he became an arch detector along the devious paths of crime. A chain broken into numerous fragments, if he got a hold of one link, he would be sure to find the others and reunite them into a perfect whole. His logical acuteness gave him great influence in court. These qualities, combined with extraordinary energy and perseverance, gave to **Mr. Burnell** his preeminence as a lawyer.

In 1840 he was married to Sarah Spurr, who still survives him. To them were born three children: Valissa, Melverton and Ella. Melverton died in 1864, of quick consumption. Ella was married to Dr. Charles Hazeltine in 1867 and died in 1873 leaving two children. Valissa, now Mrs. J.S. Cook, resides at Cedar Rapids, Iowa and is the mother of four children. On the 7th of December 1865, **Mr. Burnell** was returning from Buffalo, in poor health, having for some years been afflicted with disease of the kidneys and stopped overnight at his mother’s in Charlotte. The next day he took dinner at his sister’s, Mrs. H.H. Moore, in Sinclairville. On the evening of that day he fell in the street, a few feet from the front door of his house and breathed no more.

During the later part of his life, he had been wading through doubts on the subject of religion and especially the problem of a life to come. There is probably but one person living to whom he was accustomed to express himself fully on these great subjects. It was certain that he was longing for the rest which the faith of his fathers and of his own childhood alone could give.
