2004 Dues:

Dues for the next year would be appreciated between now and the publication of the next newsletter, Feb. 29, 2004. The printed version is still \$14 a year, which also allows you electronic access. We appreciate that vote of confidence.

We want to keep all dues on a calendar year basis; it greatly simplifies the necessary bookkeeping. Therefore, whenever you join, you receive that year's back issues.

For newspaper articles, including obituaries, please include the name of the paper it came from to include the date, city, state and page number. As most of you know, this is the same type of info we write down when researching. If you have the capability to send in your item electronically, that would be great and save us a lot of time scanning or retyping. Just send it in as an attachment to your e-mail. But we'll accept it in any format, **so send it in!**



Queries: Queries are **FREE** and will be published when received and if room permits. Please try to keep them brief. As a first response we will use Claude Bunnell's database and check with William Austin for information. We also want readers to add to the answers we provide. Please feel free to send your reply to the address at the end of the query. Please also send a copy to us so that we can share the information.



Share the Newsletter: We're not copyrighted, so you can share this newsletter with your local Genealogical Library or Historical Society or your family and friends. We're not a business.



Back Issues: Back Issues can be obtained for \$4.00 per issue, printed; that covers copying and mailing costs. We hope to eventually have all issues on the web, and they'll be available for free to subscribers. I have electronic versions of very few back issues and those are posted on the web. For those subscribers who don't have web access just let us know what issue(s) you need and we'll mail them to you at cost (\$4.00).



Web Page Update:

We have been updating the Files and Links page occasionally, though not with the frequency that we started with. We've added a "counter" to some of the pages to see how many visits we receive. This type of counter doesn't show results on the page, but will provide data to us that we'll share in the next newsletter. A counter that we had on the pages during the first three months of operation showed that in March of this year our pages were viewed 5100 times by 1900 different people. That's good for a small site with limited public interest.

We have so many things we want to do on the website that some times it's difficult to remain focused on one project. The current project we're starting is to retype all of the early Newsletters and put them on the members' web page. Scanning just won't work due to the size of the files and the time it would take you to download them. If we retype one newsletter a month, I figure it will take 5 years to complete the project. So,

WE WILL ACCEPT HELP ON THIS PROJECT. If you have the back issues and are willing to type up one or two issues, send me an e-mail and let me know. If you don't have back issues but are willing to type, we'll send you a copy of back issue(s) to type. We'll coordinate "who's doing which." For the photos etc in the newsletters, if you don't have a scanner, we'll scan those in and add them to the pages you type. I just ask that they be typed in MS Word, MS Works, Lotus WordPro, or WordPerfect. These will then be available for all subscribers with internet access. Wouldn't that be handy?

Henry Bunnell (twice) Alice Bunnell (Twice)

Irene Transue (IGTRANSUE@webtv.net) who is currently not a subscriber, is trying to research her Bunnell Line.

I haven't been able to find anything on my great grandfather Henry Bunnell and his wife Anna VanAllen. They lived in Wyoming county when my grandmother Alice Bertha Bunnell was born in Lovelton PA. I would appreciate it if anyone has information on this Bunnell family. Thank you.

Then, Carol Brotzman (brotzman@dfnow.com) , the Beaver Meadows Church Historian Tuscarora Twp Bradford County, PA, wrote to outline the lineage of a Dale King whose obituary she had sent. She forwarded the following info, originally supplied by a Pam King:

My mom's grandmother was a Bunnell, Alice Bunnell dob 03/02/1869. Alice's mom was Anna Van Allen and her dad was Henry Bunnell. They were from Wyoming Co. PA. I saw a Henry C. Bunnell on page 38&39 [of a book Carol sent her]. His parents were John S. Bunnell and Laura May Whitcomb.

Ed. Note: I checked Claude's database and census data and I don't believe that Henry, father of Alice, is the Henry C., son of John and Laura Bunnell. I could not find a Henry and Anna (Van Allen) Bunnell however.

Temperance Bunnell [CB330234] (Continued from previous Newsletter)

In the previous issue, I discussed the request by Sue Wagner for information on Temperance Bunnell and the resulting findings. In response, Joan Murray, whose book served as the basis for our research, responded by e-mail to Sue and me with some additional information, which follows:

Dear Sue, I saw the query that Charlie Bunnell put into his latest Bunnell Family Newsletter. I have written the book he refers to - *Bunnell and Allied Families*.

My grandmother, Rosa Bunnell England [CB341298] was a niece of Temperance Bunnell. My grandmother left us with the names of all her father's siblings, their spouses and their children. She called Temperance, Aunt Temmie. According to my grandmother, the children were named

Charlie, Carey, Romeo and Bertie. Perhaps some were from the second marriage. Grandmother said nothing about Temmie's death or a second marriage. Bertie, I suspect was Albert, although could have been Alberta. It seems nearly all the siblings must have greatly admired Albert Freeland, the husband of Hannah Jayne Bunnell Freeland [CB330233] because several of them named children after him - including Margaret Bunnell [CB330230] and Harmon Clark who named a son Albert and called him Libbie; James Torry Bunnell [CB330238] and Ella Leonard, who named a son Albert [CB341292] and called him Bertie; Mary C. Bunnell [CB330240] and Russell Allen who named their daughter, Albertena and called her Allie. I suspect the child called "master" born in 1860 in Minnesota is Albert (Bertie) and died in probably infancy.

I have searched for years to track James and Temperance Tracy after 1860, and now I can see from the Bunnell NL why I never found them. I never went back to New York looking for them. I always looked farther west, thinking they followed in the footpaths of some of the other siblings.

Anyway, I am glad that part of the mystery is solved. I live about hour and a half away from where Isaac Bunnell [CB320212], the father of the above, Hannah Jayne (who my Grandmother called Aunt Jennie), their daughter, Orville Mortimer [CB330232], another sibling, John [CB330231], another sibling are all buried. About 8 years ago I managed to get a C.W. tombstone put on Orville's grave. He and John were the only ones without stones in the family plot. Orville's wife, son, and daughter are buried about 1/2 way in another cemetery in a plot which belonged to the son's wife's family. I've been out there many times to do research, and based a good part of my book upon. If you haven't seen my book, it is available at many libraries, and there are still copies available at AncestorStuff.com. Those who have my book will be happy to know that the tombstones in their plot have been up righted and repaired in recent years, since I took the photos which appear in my book.

If I can answer any other questions regarding this family, I will be happy to do so.

LYMAN H. BUNNELL [CB331303]

What happened to my Lyman H. Bunnell, the brother of my great-grandfather, Asahel Cooley Bunnell [CB331304]?

Lyman H. Bunnell was born on December 16, 1843, to Henry George [CB320852] and Eliza J. (Loomis) Bunnell. He was born in New York State, probably Wyoming County (where his parents were married) or Genesee County (where his brothers Asahel and George Chapin Bunnell [CB331305] were born). There was also a sister Nellie E. Bunnell [CB331306] who was born and died in 1851.

Lyman H. Bunnell is listed in the 1850 census as age 6 in Pike, Wyoming County, NY. He is listed in the 1860 census as age 16, farm labor, again in Pike, Wyoming Co, NY.

The record of Civil War Soldiers & Sailors web site has "Leyman H. Bunnell" (index spelling), Regiment: 104 N.Y. Infantry, Union troops, Company C, Rank: Private (in and out), Film 551 roll 18. The Pike Historical Library has a note that Lyman H. Bunnell, born 1844, enlisted in 1861 in the 104 NY Infantry, served 3 years, discharged.

The obituary for his mother in Pike, NY, 1891, says that her 2 sons from Grand Rapids, Michigan, were present at her death. Both sons Asahel and George Bunnell lived in Grand Rapids in 1891. No idea where Lyman lived.

Their mother Eliza J. (Loomis) Bunnell's husband Henry George Bunnell, had died in 1857. Eliza remarried Luther Chapin Jr. in 1865 or 1866. He had apparently died before her death in 1891. Luther Chapin Jr. was her step-brother, and the Chapin family was apparently very close to the Bunnell and Loomis families.

A family note written probably in about 1890 lists most of the Bunnell family births, marriages and deaths. Lyman H. Bunnell's birth date is listed, but no further information.

No more information on Lyman has been found. I have explored various spellings of Lyman and Bunnell/Bonnell. Probably his middle name was Henry after his father and grandfather, as family names were used prevalently; I have tried to locate a possible Henry. The Chapin family was inter-married with the Bunnell and Loomis families; I have tried to pursue that last name.

So... Where's Lyman? Any clues would be most welcome!

Colleen is looking for the ancestry of Martha Bunnell. Colleen found a Marion County (IN) marriage record showing her name as Bounel. Between Claude's database, Colleen's info, and some census searching I did, we know that she was born about 1810 in Ohio, married George Metsker in 1830 in IN or OH, had at least one probably 2 children (one named James Bunnell Metsker), a granddaughter Clara Mills born in 1860, and was a widow in Noblesville, Hamilton Co., IN in 1880. We don't know her ancestry however. A relative "seems to remember some family member was a 'grave marker maker.'" That could tie her in with the Urbana, OH Bunnells, but I could not find the connection.

Biography

DANIEL BUNNELL

This issue's biography was provided by Tobias Bunnell, 214 Henry Street, Urbana, Ohio 43078, tbunnell@woh.rr.com. He says that, "I'm not sure who wrote that Biological Sketch I sent you, It was hand written on the backs of several Bunnell Monument company invoices dated September 1914. A cousin of mine, Jean Bunnell Wiley who passed away last fall had kept many family documents which I happened to inherit. She had two sons, neither in which have children of their own, so they decided to send them to me in order to keep them passed down in the family. Jean was the daughter of Leslie Clifton Bunnell, the last owner of our Monument Company which he sold in 1946."

Daniel Bunnell ran a marble shop along an old Indian trail in Xenia, Ohio on the present site of the Dodd's Bros. Plant. Noah Bunnell learned his trade under his father at Xenia, moving to West Liberty in 1860 where he conducted a shop to help out wage contributions which came to him as Methodist Minister. He convened his circuit on horseback and often would use horse and wagon carrying marble slabs which when sold would letter on the spot and erect before morning. War conditions decided Noah Bunnell to discontinue business in West Liberty and establish a shop in Bellefontaine, Ohio in 1863. Here John and Daniel learned their trade while still too small to reach a mans size carving bench, having to stand on a box. Ed was born in Bellefontaine. When the family moved to Covington, Indiana in about 1866, Daniel walked to Urbana and worked 12 and 14 hours a day lettering marble for either Runyans or Al Ross, soon taking over a half interest. This shop was located on the John Smith property now owned by the J. F. Brand heirs, N. Main street near E. Church. Moved from their to the present site of Pickenings grocery. When the Brand-Wicker brick block was being built, he was forced to relocate again, moving to a new frame building of John Smith now the Chinese laundry paying a monthly rental of \$18.00.

In the fall of 1882 the Bunnell family came from Covington, Indiana. Elmer, John and Ed driving the wagon of household goods while remainder followed by train. They took up residence at 835 N. Main in the Jennings property and lived their till the following spring of 1883 moving to a small farm north of the Illinois Car and Equipment Co. formerly known as the U.S. Rolling Stock Co. Ed and Elmer begun at once to rub stone and cut bases for Daniel. Ed also teaming and working the farm and garden. In about 1890, about the time the stone contract for the Baptist church was completed and masonry work of Dugan bridge commenced, Daniel together with his brother Elmer, who had two years experience as clerk in John Rhoades and Ridge Wilkins grocery, bought out a grocery located in the S.W. corner of the square now occupies by Longs Restaurant, again later moving to where the Busy Bee Restaurant now is. This venture was conducted jointly with monument business. The grocery business was never a paying venture and in 1893 was heavily in debt and abandoned. Many years were required to return the losses caused by this venture. An increase of rental of \$20.00 determined Daniel to move his monument business and gamble on owning his own building. About this time the high School burned in 1897 and the securing of the contract for brick and stonework on the new building encouraged him to build our present brick building on the land already owned by him. Work was begun in summer of 1898 and rushed to completion. " Snip" Anderson laid the brick for a horse in an even trade. The land purchase and building expenses left a heavy debt which had to be carried for years. During this time John Wright, Elmer and Ed were employed more or less continuously. Old Dutch John was a character that never failed to follow payday with a " regular" spree. A Civil War veteran who in later years would emerge periodically from the Dayton Soldiers home with his bi-monthly paycheck and visit his old friends. When well saturated and warned that Dan Bunnell would give him a good blessing out if he didn't sober up, he would loudly decry that he was not afraid of Dan Bunnell and his seven brothers. However the appearance of Dan was usually enough to render old John quite docile. A varied collection of humanity worked for and were loyal to their employer and staunch friend. The three Creary brothers, Steve, John, and Larry whose failing for strong liquor was a constant trial.

Research Findings

Carol Brotzman, the Beaver Meadows Church Historian Tuscarora Twp Bradford County, PA contacted us with a query (see that section for her questions), but after some e-mail correspondence started sending some photos and other data. Here are a couple of photos she provided.



This was an item being offered on e-bay that Carol notified several folks about.

Cora A. Bunnell [CB340158] was born August 1880 in Meshoppen, Wyoming Co., PA. The 1910 census shows her as a single school teacher in Meshoppen. By the 1920 census she was living in Washington, DC and working as a government clerk. I could not locate her in any state, or D.C, in the 1930 census. Her lineage is:

Anne Barrett has provided some electronic copies of a letter written by Thomas Bunnell [CB005287]. She says that this letter is from Thomas James/Dean Bonnel, to his father Jonathan. At the time the letter was written, Thomas had married the second Elizabeth (Gaines Treadway). You will note that the letter refers to their new daughter, Eliza, born two months before. NOTE: Jonathan and his daughter, Sarah, both spell their names Bonnel on their tombstones but tombstones are so often incorrect, I don't give that a whole lot of weight. You may share copies of Thomas' letter with anyone. (God bless my grandmother (Rebecca's granddaughter) for keeping it safe all these years.) It is worth mentioning that the estate papers filed for Jonathan, Sr. contain a reference to the \$200 note that Thomas asks his father to pay in this letter. One page is the actual handwritten note by Thomas Bonnel to Jesse Cox (as the letter says). The curious thing is that Thomas signs it over to his father thus:

Jonathan Bunnell you will please redeem the above note and oblige yours to . . .
Thomas Bonnel. (Actual spellings.)

September the 7th 1852

Dear father I embrace this opportunity to inform you that we are all well hoping this may find you all enjoy the same blessing I have given Jesse Cox my note for 200 dollars and have taken one for the same amount you to accept and pay the same to Jesse Cox and oblige me I want you to let me no as soon as possible whether you pay this note or not and don't delay for I don't know how to arrange my business til I hear from you I have not much to write we have a daughter about 2 months old we call it Eliza Corn and hogs is selling high Good corn is 10 dollars per acre hogs is selling as high as four dollars gross I have had letters from Highfill and Jacobs lately they were all well and say they are doing well
