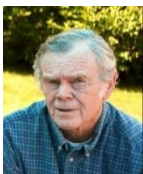

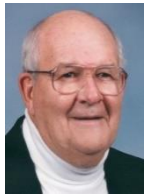

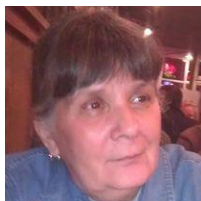

A Mulino boy died and his friend was injured after crashing their motorcross bikes into a water truck on a race track near Toutle, Wash. Saturday afternoon.

Dylan Bunnell, 17, of Mulino, and his friend, Anthony Hamilton Jr., 14, of Dundee, were riding at Riverdale Raceway, about three miles from Toutle. The track had been open for practice Saturday, but was temporarily closed for routine run maintenance at the time of the accident.

Cowlitz County Sheriff Chief Deputy Charlie Rosenzweig said the crash occurred around 2:45 p.m. Saturday.

According to reports, the two boys entered the track, unaware it was under a temporary closure for routine watering.

Rosenzweig said the boys rounded a curve on the track and approached a large jump. The water truck was approaching from the opposite direction, and due to the hill, the boys could not see the truck. As they climbed the hill and went airborne, both boys struck the approaching water truck head on, landing on the grill and hood.

Both boys were wearing helmets and protective gear at the time of the crash. Bunnell was pronounced dead at the scene. Hamilton was taken to St John's Medical Center for treatment of cuts and bruises.

Dylan was the son of Bob Bunnell, of Mulino, and Nannette Savage.

Bunnell family and friends gathered at the Mulino home of Dylan's grandparents Sunday. Marianne Bunnell, Dylan's grandmother, said Dylan and his father have been living with them.

"We are reeling," she said Sunday. "Dylan had gone up there to practice on Saturday, and he was supposed to race on Sunday, and he didn't know the track was not open when he crashed."

She said Dylan started racing only a little over a year ago. The entire family showed up to watch all his races.

"He was mastering the racing world quickly, moving up levels rapidly," she said. "Dylan was extremely successful. Motorcross was his love.

"We were all anxious for the racing season to start, so we could root him on," she said. "He and his dad — that's how they spent their time together. His dad was always there, helping him and others at the race track when they needed it. They were a really a team.

On its website, Riverdale Raceway co-owners Dan and Audrey Dale wrote: "Due to the tragic accident at the track today, Riverdale will be closed tomorrow, March 8. Our condolences to the family of the young man who died. Our hearts go out the them. Please keep them in your thoughts and prayers as well as all who witnessed the tragedy."

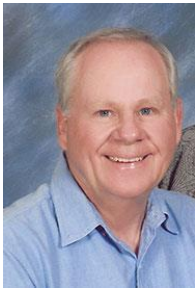

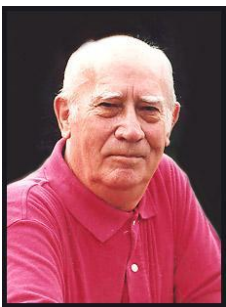

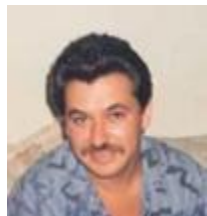
